### FROM THE RECTOR

The God we know and worship is known to those around us by what we do in Jesus's name. This is why we are God's stewards. In the Biblical world a steward was the person who ran the household while the master was away. They acted as the master would act.

That is what stewardship is. We steward what is God's. It is essential to understand that In Hebrew thought everything belonged to God. What we have and what we use seems to be ours because God is a spirit, but in truth everything we have has been given to us by God and belongs to God. One day it will be returned.



This idea flies in the face of our cultural assumptions about autonomy. But it also puts our lives in a true perspective. When we talk about tithing, it is out of gratitude for all that we have been given. And what we have been given is a teaching to take care of ourselves and those in our care, and for us also to take care of all of God's creations.

When I think about what I don't have, I often get stuck in a pretty petty, selfish place. But when I think about what I have been given, I am overwhelmed by the generosity of God and the provision of my life.

As we look at the resources of our common life, after all we are a people of Common Prayer, we begin to see the resources of our church very differently. What we have to take care of and reach out with are amazing. The circle of impact of this community is huge, and when we add our resources to those around us we find that we can do more for God than we could imagine.

Your time and money are truly multiplied when given into a community to do ministry. And there is always enough in our lives when we are responsible to God's way. It is amazing to actually witness. Grace shows up.

The stories around this community about Grace showing up include building a church school in the Dominican Republic through a bequest and paying for school books for a nursing student. It is people showing up with communion after surgery and meals after the birth of a child. Grace shows up openhanded because we know that everything we have comes from the One who loves us.

We are the stewards of Grace. All of us, each of us, together. Thank God, it is what we are made for. we are made for this. daniel +

## GRACE HAPPENS HERE IN STEWARDSHIP OF GOD'S KINGDOM: Week 2

**Grace is a place where the Holy Spirit is alive and well, working through us and among us to accomplish Christ's work of redeeming the world. Despite the fact that our church has begun its transition between rectors, our ministries are thriving and our campus has never looked better.**

We are at an important time in the life of our congregation—the transition from the announcement of Daniel's leaving to our new rector's arrival. By God's grace and provision, we can take advantage of this fertile time with a new commitment to ministry. As each of us gives generously of our time, talent, and financial resources, we will continue in Grace's long tradition of shining as a beacon of Christ's love in the Traverse City area and beyond.

Because of changes resulting from our transition, the draft budget for 2016 has not been finalized. The Vestry will vote on a balanced budget at their December meeting, and the amounts pledged will inform their decision-making. Though the numbers are from last year, this narrative budget will convey a real picture of what we're doing through the generosity of members and friends. One budget item that we'll need to include over the next two years is the cost of a rector search. When we brought Daniel on board 7 years ago, we spent \$20,000 for the search and expect that we will spend that much or more for this search.



How often have you said or heard the words, "Welcome to Grace"? Probably hundreds; maybe thousands. Because our ethic of welcome permeates all we do, we welcome not just in words but in deeds as well. We treat newcomers, visitors and each other with love and caring. During the week our staff and volunteers welcome all who cross our threshold. People who are struggling financially or spiritually are treated with dignity, respect and are given practical help. Many groups like AA and Oryana find a welcoming home here. With the challenges of our busy lifestyles, we need to do everything in our power to keep people up-to-date with parish activities. This includes our fabulous website which allows us to stay current and reach people inside and outside the

Grace community, the Gracevine weekly email updates, Grace Life bulletin inserts, and special mailings. Right before Easter we will welcome our interim rector who will help us to rediscover ourselves and strengthen our faith over the next 18 months. Our financial and spiritual resources welcome and nurture people of all generations, political persuasions, income levels, and sexual orientations to feel at home and know the fullness of God's love through our warm welcome.

**The budget for the Welcome Ministry in 2015 was \$158,000.**



Our house of God is first and foremost a house of worship and prayer. Although our four worship services each week vary in the degree of formality, all are based on the Book of Common Prayer. We hear the Word of God, give thanks for God's blessings, pray for others and ourselves, and celebrate Holy Communion around God's table. We hear inspiring and uplifting sermons that not only sustain us for the coming

week, but also challenge us to live out the Gospel in our daily lives. Our three choirs lead us in song with a variety of musical styles. Our staff and volunteers prepare the worship bulletins that guide us through our worship services. We welcome new Christians as they receive the Sacrament of Holy Baptism—six new Christians are being baptized today! We share the joy of people when they are joined in marriage, and say goodbye to family and friends at funerals. We mark the seasons of the church year with special services. No matter what the occasion, worshiping in community binds us together, opens us to receive God's grace, and then sends us out to embody Christ's love to a hurting world.

**STUDY** Preaching and teaching that grows our faith is a hallmark of Grace Church. No matter what your age, we have offerings that will make a difference in our relationship with God. Our small groups engender thoughtful study; friendships grow. Beginning in preschool, our young people participate in meaningful Sunday school programs that are tailored to their ages. Our dedicated staff and gifted volunteers make it happen.

**The budget for our study ministry in 2015 was \$81,000.**



**Service** is where the people of Grace really shine! We are known throughout the region for our care and service to the poor, hungry, and homeless people in our community—through the award-winning Jubilee House, Friday lunch program, our new food pantry, our hygiene pantry, Safe Harbor participation, and the discretionary fund. But we serve in so many other ways as well. Our love for one another grows when we realize how incomplete we are without each other. When we are sick, lonely, frightened, or grieving, we need to connect with others. As we bear each other's burdens, we strengthen one another and ourselves, too. Besides the informal

network of friends helping friends, we serve one another through hospital visits, prayer, Lay Eucharistic Visitors, pastoral support, our prayer shawl ministry, and our grief support group, to name a few. We also serve our diocese and the national Episcopal Church through our financial giving. Both invest a considerable portion of their budgets in ministry to the whole world.

**The budget for our Service ministries in 2015 was \$252,000.**




**Debt Service** When we built a new worship space to welcome more people and purchased the adjoining brown house to hold in trust for future generations, our original price tag was 2.6 million. We've made great progress and, as of the end of September 2014, we reduced our debt to \$463,000.

**The proposed budget for our debt service in 2015 was \$83,000.**

*Where do the numbers come from? Some expenses, such as insurance and utilities, are divided evenly among our four core ministries. Others, such as staff compensation, are allocated according to the amount of time that is spent in duties that benefit each of the core ministries.*

\* Other Income: At Grace, because approximately 24 percent of our total expenses are offset through reimbursements, endowments, rent, and gifts, we will need \$544,534 in pledges and contributions from members and friends to achieve our goal of a balanced budget.

The budget for 2016 will be approved by the Vestry at their December meeting.
